The seven launch authors on our eclectic 2026 list include global bestseller Heather Morris, author of The Tattooist of Auschwitz, who returns to her heartland next October with The Piano Teacher of Montparnasse, an astonishing novel based on a true story of bravery and Resistance in wartime Paris, and acclaimed writer Christy Lefteri, author of The Beekeeper of Aleppo, whose compelling new novel explores the football leagues formed by women factory workers during the first world war. It promises to be a heart-breaking and exhilarating story of conflict, family, and a game that changed the world.

Our publishing year opens in March with I Am You by Victoria Redel. A mesmerising meditation on gender and artistic creation, this unforgettable love story reimagines the life of renowned still life painter Maria van Oosterwijck during the Dutch Golden Age.

In June, comes The Secret History of the Universe, Jonathan Black's follow-up to his ground-breaking first book The Secret History of the World. Here, Black offers pure intellectual entertainment in a character-driven history of mysticism and its influence on modern science. In July, we publish Black Earth, the first in the ambitious Stoke Rising trilogy. Set against the background of the miners' strikes of 1984 and a family divided, it will cement crime writer and ex-Met detective Kate London as a uniquely talented writer to watch.

In November we publish France's most-read novelist Marc Levy. The Bookshop of Forbidden Books is a brilliant and thought-provoking comedy, a love story, and a tribute to the transformative power of literature. It is destined to capture the hearts of book lovers everywhere. Our 2026 ends with Marian of Sherwood, Anya Bergman's feminist retelling of the Robin Hood legend. Part folk horror, part heroine's quest, it will delight readers with its universal themes of love, nature, selfhood and destiny.





In 1942, the Nazis arrested a Jewish family living in Montparnasse, occupied Paris. In the chaos, the eleven-year-old daughter fled to the only person she trusted: her piano teacher, Andrée Levallois, secretly a French Resistance operative. Andrée took her in, risking everything. But the authorities were closing in, and soon Andrée and the girl were caught in a desperate race to stay alive. Andrée was denounced, arrested, tortured, and sent to the hell of Ravensbrück Women's concentration camp. She fought for her life, determined to return and honour her promise to save the girl who had been entrusted to her care.

Heather Morris was born in New Zealand. Her life changed in 2003 when she met Lale Sokolov. Heather's books have sold over 19 million copies worldwide and been translated into over 50 languages.




